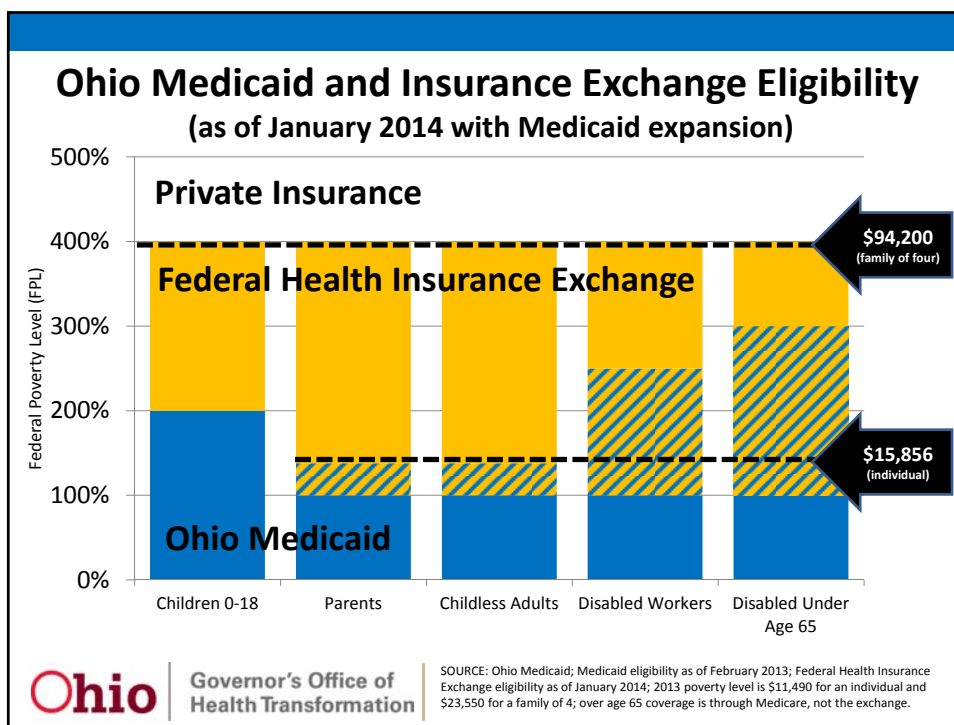
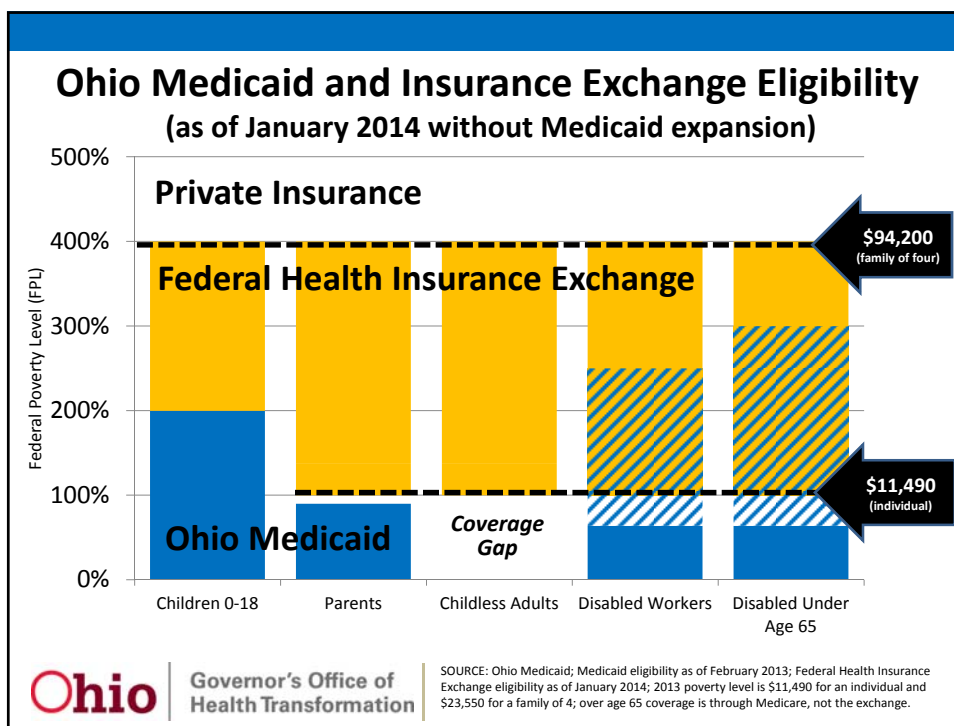
The Relationship Between Income Inequality and Health Outcomes

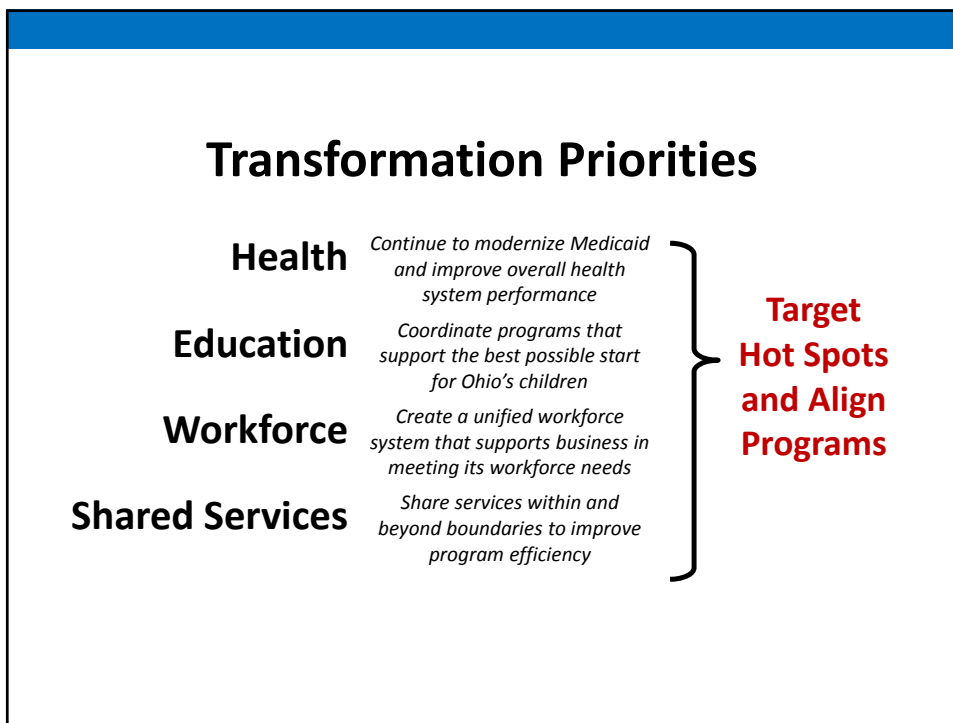
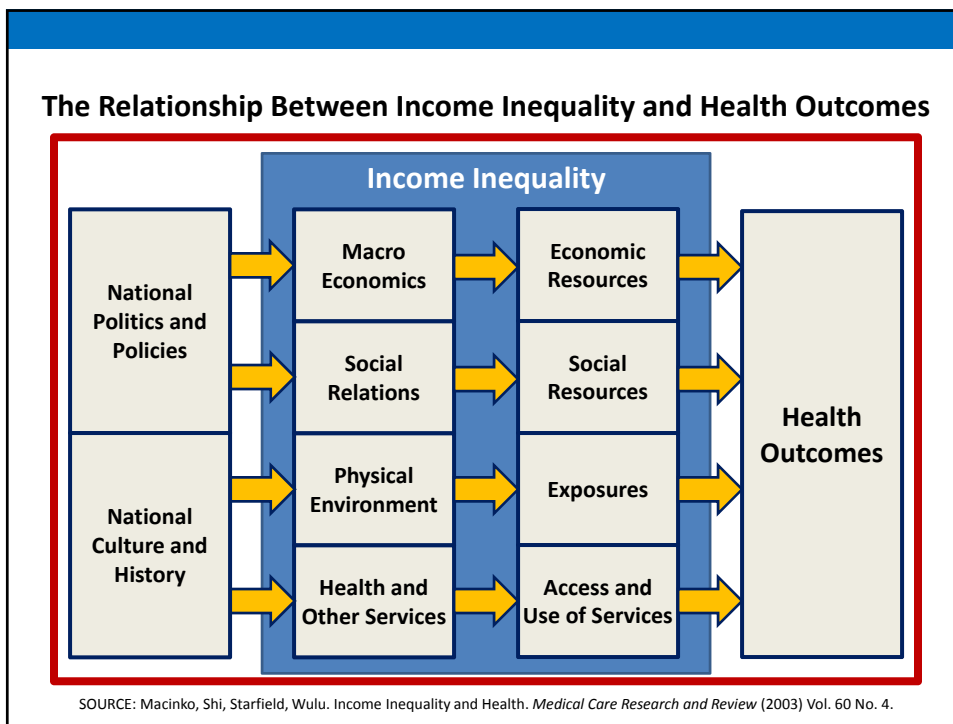
